QUESTION FOR ChatGPT: Create a Boolean search string that uses truncation and phrase searching for the research question "According to the latest research, what are the most common symptoms of 'long COVID' for Black women?"

ANSWER: ("long COVID" OR "post-acute sequelae of SARS-CoV-2 infection" OR "PASC") AND ("Black women" OR African-American women" OR "African descent") AND ("symptoms" OR "manifestations" OR "clinical presentation") AND "latest research"

- Where has ChatGPT gone wrong here?
- How would you correct these missteps?

AI + The Latest Research

QUESTION FOR ChatGPT: According to the latest research, what are the most common symptoms of "long COVID" for Black women?

ANSWER: As of my last knowledge update in January 2022, I don't have access to specific information on the latest research conducted after that date.
