Keynote Presenter: Amanda Folk



Dr. Amanda L. Folk is an assistant professor and Head of the Teaching & Learning Department in the University Libraries at The Ohio State University. Folk leads the Teaching & Learning Department to identify scalable and sustainable approaches to developing the information literacy of Ohio State students. Folk's scholarship combines her professional interests in teaching, learning, and information literacy with her desire to support student populations that have traditionally been marginalized in higher education. Her article

"Reframing Information Literacy as Academic Cultural Capital: A Critical and Equity-Based Foundation for Practice, Assessment, and Scholarship" won the 2020 Ilene F. Rockman Instruction Publication of the Year Award from ACRL's Instruction Section. The focus of MILEX's 2025 Spring Conference is inspired by Folk's book chapter "Information Literacy Through an Equity Mindset," published in 2023 in Hicks, Lloyd, and Pilerot's *Information Literacy Through Theory.* Please check it out!
