Eric Kowalik is author of “Leveraging Online Tutorials and Performance Assessment to Improve Information Literacy Instruction” and a Digital Technology and Design Specialist at Marquette University, where he collaborates with faculty and librarians to develop interactive online learning objects for stand-alone instruction or integration into program curricula. Before joining Marquette, he was a web developer at the University of California, Irvine. He earned his bachelor's degree in journalism and history and his MA in Communication from Marquette University. He also earned his MS in Instructional Design and Technology from California State University, Fullerton.

Katie Greer is author of “A Pedagogy of Care for Information Literacy and Metaliteracy Asynchronous Online Instruction” and a Professor in OU Libraries at Oakland University in Rochester, Michigan. She holds her BA in English from Aquinas College, her MA in Art History from the University of Notre Dame, her MLIS from Drexel University, and is working on her PhD in Educational Leadership from Oakland University. Her research interests include information literacy for an information-disordered world, visual literacy, feminist/critical pedagogies, and sustainability leadership.
